BUILDING A FUTURE

Going home to care for her daughter after a productive day of work, Andrea is living the life she never thought possible. Sober for two years and preparing to move into her own apartment with her 3-year-old, Andrea wants to maximize the second chance she's been given.

Growing-up, Andrea's family moved frequently, and she was never in one place long enough to make friends. Battling depression, Andrea found solace in going with her dad to work at construction sites on the weekend. Working with her hands helped her take her mind off her loneliness.

At 13, Andrea started experimenting with drugs to connect with her peers and was quickly overtaken by addiction. "I was more interested in drugs than anything else," she says.

On a downward spiral, Andrea's grades plummeted, and she was kicked out of school.

With no direction, she had some run-ins with the law and spent her time in and out of jail. At 19, and behind bars, she gave birth to her daughter. Once released Andrea continued to use drugs and didn't have much hope for herself or her ability to raise her daughter. "I thought I would end up in the gutter and my daughter wouldn't know me because of my poor choices," she says.

When her daughter turned 9 months old, Andrea went to rehab and her counselor told her about Hope Builders. Recalling her fond memories of working with her dad on construction sites, Andrea applied.

"I wanted to do something related to construction," she recalls.

While at Hope Builders, Andrea learned more than the art of the construction trade. "Hope Builders gave me a new perspective and respect for myself," she says.

Thanks to the training and life skills support she received at Hope Builders,

"Hope Builders helped me stand on my own two feet, my family's life will never be the same."

Andrea is now an Electrician at Sunwest Electric making \$15/hour and will become the second female in the company to work out in the field. "I have showed my boss that I can keep up with the guys," says Andrea.

Becoming a valued employee and aspiring to grow in her role, Andrea is taking classes to become a journeyman. "I see myself advancing in this company and increasing my income," she says.

Andrea and her daughter are moving out on their own. "Hope Builders helped me stand on my own two feet, my family's life will never be the same," says Andrea.
