CHAMPIONS OF OPPORTUNITY:

PAT AND JILL ORTIZ

Pat and Jill Ortiz are Heroes of Hope who helped lay the foundation, quite literally, from which Hope Builders continues to empower young people to build a pathway to prosperity.

Their journey began in 1997, when Hope Builders was still young and bench making was one of the few hands-on opportunities available to students. As a seasoned professional in the construction industry, Pat saw potential. He and Jill jumped in offering financial support, rallying friends, and opening doors to industry connections.

Pat advocated moving beyond benches to full-scale construction training. As the program expanded, it became clear Hope Builders needed more space in which to accomplish this. Soon after, our founder Sister Eileen dragged Pat to any and every rundown location in Santa Ana. Pat and Jill encouraged her to dream bigger. Together, they helped secure a newly built warehouse a few blocks from the downtown location and raise funds to make the construction training center a reality.



Additionally, Pat served as a board member for 9 years and was Chairman for 3 years. During his tenure, he worked with the management team to provide guidance for the development of the training curriculum. Ultimately, the approach to skills training became the program model the organization continues to deploy today—hands-on training coupled with mentorship, employment and life skills.

Through their involvement, Pat and Jill Ortiz have helped young people build careers, confidence, and hope for their future.

HOPE IN ACTION:

ALUMNA PERLA LOPEZ

An 1996, at just 18 years old, Perla Lopez stood at a crossroads. She had dropped out of high school, was pregnant, and felt lost with no prospects for how to provide for herself and her daughter. But internally, a transformation had begun. Motherhood ignited a determination in Perla to break the cycle of poverty and build a better life for her child.

When Perla heard about Hope Builders, she leapt at the opportunity for a second chance and a path forward.

Hope Builders helped Perla earn her GED, taught her life skills, from how to interview and dress professionally to opening a bank account and getting a driver's license.

Perla's first job was as a receptionist at the Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange. She later joined Hope Builders' staff, dedicating 21 years to helping others walk the same path she had. "Hope Builders is my alma mater," she says with pride.

Throughout her career, Perla has exemplified the traits that make a Hero of Hope: initiative,

accountability, resilience and reliability. In spite of any challenges she faced, she continuously committed the time and effort to improve her skills, advance her career and realize her dreams. Today, Perla is the Executive Assistant to the Office of the Co-Presidents at Rady Children's Hospital in Orange County, where her skillset and experience provide valuable support to the executive suite.

To Perla, Hope Builders didn't just help her find a job—it transformed generations. Her daughter Melissa, who Perla was pregnant with when she joined Hope Builders, is now a Senior Software Engineer at Google and an NYU graduate. Her son Jesse is studying Civil Engineering at Cal State Fullerton.

ABAE looks to Hope Builders Career Connections (HBCC), the organization's social enterprise staffing agency, to hire behavioral technicians to meet their staffing needs.

Over the past decade, the Orange County behavioral health sector has seen a growing need for workers trained to support children with autism and related diagnoses. By partnering with HBCC, ABAE has gained access to a pipeline of motivated, trained talent prepared to make an immediate impact as behavioral technicians. In total, they have hired 27 Hope Builders alumni over the past several years. These young adults are providing a valuable service to the county, improving outcomes for children with disabilities and their families.

ABAE is a catalyst for change and a Hero of Hope. Their leadership not only strengthens their own workforce but helps shape the future of our community.
